.Monday 4th April 2011 Action Round-up

Britannia Cup action at Second Meadow Biggleswade United, saw holders Caldecote go down to a 1-0 Semi-final defeat at the hands of Leighton United. Paul Darton striking the games only goal 23 minutes into the contest. United will now return to Second Meadow on Saturday 7th May to face either Renhold United or Shefford Town & Campton who meet at Hillgrounds Kempston Rovers, in the second semi-final a week on Wednesday April 13th.

In Division One league action, Bedford Hatters failed to close the gap on Potton Wanderers at the head of the league table when going down to their first defeat in 11 outings at FC Meppershall, two goals from Craig Damon only being replied to by Ben Brown to give the home side a 2-1 victory.

In the lone Division Two action, Lea Sports PSG climbed themselves up into second spot just three points shy of league leaders Elstow Abbey on whom they still have three games in hand with a 2-1 win at Great Barford. James Awofisan netted both goals against a home reply via the penalty spot from Adam Dunville.

Division Three action was to see second place Pavenham lose their seasons 100% away record when held to a 1-1 draw at Royal Oak Kempston. Lorenzo Jordan on the scoresheet for the home side against a Pavenham reply from Michael Bates.

Elsewhere, Wilshamstead Reserves were running out 4-1 winners at Flitwick Town Reserves. Kieron Colclough with a brace plus strikes from Hani Thiarri and Harry Baker only replied to by Harry Rowlands.

In Division Four, second place Goldington took their away winning ways up to seven games with a 3-1 victory at Bedford Park Rangers, Karl Anderson, Kieran Bridger and Brian Day all finding the back of the day against a Rangers reply from Shaun Finlay. Whilst Potton Town kept themselves right there in the promotion mix with a 3-2 win at Kempston Athletic. Chris Cooper, Matt Drew and Nick Gilbert netting the vital goals against Athletic replies from Dave Wild and Jason Beddall.

Wednesday 6th April 2011 Action Round-Up

Shefford Town & Campton's lead at the head of The Premier Division supported by Sportsform league table is now down to just a single point after second place Blunham netted their sixth home win on the bounce with a 4-2 victory over Sharnbrook. Andy Smith with a brace plus Tim Gill and Matty McMahon netting the goals against replies from Luke Devine and Shaun Barnett, Blunham even having the luxury of Andrew Vallom missing from the penalty spot for the second game running.

Down at the other end of the table, AFC Kempston Town gained a valuable point in their quest to stay out of the drop zone by drawing 2-2 at home with Oakley Sports. Danny Pilgrim bagging both goals against replies from Mark Smith and Jamie Endersby.

It was not a good night for bottom of the table Arlesey Town Reserves, they were defeated for the eighth time on the bounce, 1-7 at home by Wilshamstead, Michael Taylor with a hat-trick, Chris Faulkner with a brace plus single strikes from Paul Jones and Colin Marshall doing the damage against a home reply via Mark Leach.

For Division One league leaders Potton Wanderers, it was their sixth win on the bounce to stay six points clear at the head of the table by sending Sandy to their first defeat in 13 outings, 4-1 at The Recreation Ground. Daniel Stafford shot the home side ahead after just 10 minutes but it was game over by the break with The Wanderers strolling into a three goal lead, Craig Schurek, Antony Schurek, Chris Sams and Joe Harrington doing the damage, a nap hand being denied them when Craig Schurek slammed a penalty 20 minutes from time against the crossbar.

But keeping up the pressure are second place Bedford Hatters who still have three games in hand, they won by the same scoreline at Meltis Albion. Mark Reed, Darek Jozwiak, Ashley Deverall and Dean Lebrecht all finding the back of the net against a lone Albion reply via Asa Garlick.

It was not such a good night for third place Marston Shelton Rovers, they were beaten 0-1 at home by Bedford Sports Athletic thanks to a goal from Asa Mead.

For Ickwell & Old Warden Reserves, it was a return to winning ways for the first time in nine outings in a 2-0 home win over Henlow, Dan Threadgold and Dan Jones netting the vital strikes.

In Division Two, first half goals from Dave McCarthy and Harry Ellis took Elstow Abbey to a 2-0 home win over Westoning Recreation Club, who were losing for the first time in seven outings, to take them five points clear at the head of the league table after second place Lea Sports PSG were held to a 1-1 home draw by Shefford Town & Campton Reserves, Adam Larsen giving the visitors a 22nd minute lead before Thomas Feeney levelled matters eight minutes later.

For promotion seeking Kings AFC, it was a shock 1-2 home defeat at the hands of bottom of the table Kempston Hammers Sports, David Horn and Stephen Walker on The Hammers scoresheet against a home reply via Rowan Hazelwood.

Elsewhere, Lidlington United Sports are now unbeaten in their last five away outings after winning 3-1 at Stopsley Park. Alex Burrows with a brace plus Kieran Wills the United goal heroes against a Park reply via Lee Russell.

Division Three action saw Co-op Sports top score by running out 5-1 winners at Wilshamstead Reserves, Paul Power, Karolis Grazys, Thomas Miller, Scott Davis and Chris Vardy all finding the back of the net against a lone Neil Greig reply. Yet their slim chance of getting back into the promotion race took a knock with victories being gained by both M & DH Oakley and Sundon Park Rangers.

Third place Rangers with two goals Sam Chapman plus strikes from Matty Conway and Nick Buttigeig against a brace in reply from Liam Boyle 4-2 winners at Westoning Recreation Club Reserves, whilst M & DH were 2-1 home winners over Renhold Village, Ben Williams and Nicolo Mattia the home marksman against a Village reply from Dan Luke.

The lone Division Four action saw bottom of the table Wootton Village net a 6-4 home win over Kempston Athletic, Rob Edinburgh and Adam Flynn netting twice alongside Steve Woodford and Ryan Stocker from the penalty spot, whilst The Athletic replies came via Gary Whitbread, Jason Beddall, Paul Dellow and an own goal.

261. (10,011) (2,996th 'new' ground) Wednesday 30th March 2011. AFC Kempston Town 0 Blunham 7 (Bedfordshire County League Premier Division) (6pm kick off) att 10 approx. I wasn't sure if to count this as a 'new' ground or not, as really it's in the AFC Kempston Rovers complex. But as Rovers have now fenced this ground off from theirs and the club have their own dressing rooms, in the same building as Rovers do, I decided that this was sufficient criteria for a 'tick'. This evening this was the start of my 'famous for 15 minutes' spell and for much of the first half I was being photographed in readiness for the article on me in the Biggleswade Chronicle on the following Friday. The photographer wanted a picture of me with the ball in the background, but with Town not attacking very much in the first half we moved to the end Blunham were attacking, just in time for Town to have their best spell of the game. In fact when Blunham took a 30th minute lead, by way of an own goal it was against the run of play. I didn't see the foul which led to the twice taken spot kick, for encroachment, four minutes later, because the lady was still trying to take my photo. In the second half Blunham soon became the better side without really playing that well and slowly the game slipped from the hosts and Blunham gradually piled home the goals.

262. (10,012) Wednesday 30th March 2011. Bedford Hatters 3 Marston Shelton Rovers 0 (Bedfordshire County League Centenary Cup Semi Final) (Played at AFC Kempston Rovers) (7.45pm kick off) att 150 approx. After the previous game had finished we had about ten minutes to walk the fifty yards or so to our second game of the evening and my third of the day. The game kicked off a tinge late because the lights on one of the pylons failed to come on and eventually never did. The first half saw the Hatters create most of the scoring opportunities but in truth neither side really looked like finding the net. However after the break the outcome of the game was soon decided and after Scotty Alleyne got the first goal for the Hatters on 51 minutes ex-Wootton Blue Cross superstar Darek Jozwiak got their second goal 3 minutes later. A third goal from Mark Reed on 70 minutes made sure. For most of this match the crowd were very quiet. One of the main reasons for this was that they were mainly made up of Marston Shelton Rovers fans. They were a studious lot and as much as they were disappointed with the outcome they accepted their defeat with exceptionally good grace, knowing that actually they contributed much to a decent evenings entertainment

263. (10,013) Thursday 31st March 2011. Langford Reserves 1 Ickwell & Old Warden 2 (Biggleswade & District Knock Out Cup Semi Final) att 25 approx. There is always one thing that amazes me on my visits to Forde Park and that is that there always seems to be more cars parked in the car park than there are players, official and spectators combined! Anyway in this low key match it was Ickwell who took a 16th minute lead by way of a direct free kick from just outside the area. We in the stand were looking right over the shoulder of the taker, even though he was seventy yards away and we could see just where he was going to put his shot, but we weren't quick enough to rush up the other end and warn the keeper! After this Langford played a little better, so when Ickwell got their second goal on 28 minutes it was a bit against the run of play. But after the Reds cleared an Ickwell shot off the line, three minutes later, they did pull a goal back on 41 minutes, when a long range shot bounced just in front of the keeper and then went straight through him. The second half saw Langford largely in control but in truth they didn't look like scoring again, even after Ickwell had a player sent off on 54 minutes for GBH of the tongue!

Preview for Weekend Friday 15th April/ Saturday 16th April 2011 and beyond.

Action this weekend starts on Friday evening with the staging of two games. The big match of course is the final of this season's Bedfordshire FA Junior Cup at The Hollow, Potton United, where in a 7.45pm kick off, Elstow Abbey take to the field against Pavenham. The second game being at Stevington Playing Fields in Division Two, where Stevington will be in action in a 6.15pm kick off against Marabese Ceramics.

If the Premier Division supported by Sportsform title race is not already down to just two clubs, then it could well be after this weekend following Wilshamstead's visit to Moggerhanger Playing Fields to take on title favourites Blunham. The visitors needing to find a way of ending the reigning champions unbeaten home ways for the season to keep the title race a three club affair.

The other club with title aspirations are of course Shefford Town & Campton, they journey to Oakley Playing Fields to face Oakley Sports looking for their tenth win on the bounce against a home outfit that has won just two of its last seven home outings.

There is of course plenty to play for at the other end of the table, none more so than at Harvey Close where relegation haunted Woburn, now without an away win since early September travel to face home side Caldecote who have dropped out of the championship race by losing their last three home games.

AFC Kempston Town will also be anxious to collect some points at Hillgrounds when they look to end a winless run of three home games against visitors Dunton. Whilst perhaps still looking over their shoulder at the other results are Sharnbrook, they hit the road to Steppingley Road looking for just their third away win of the season against hosts Flitwick Town.

The other top flight action takes place at Stanbridge Road, the venue for Leighton United's home encounter with Renhold United beaten just once on the road this season.

In Division One, all eyes in the championship race will turn to Miller Road where 100% at home Bedford Hatters receive a visit from a Blunham Reserves side that has won just once on the road all season. Whilst Marston Shelton Rovers fading promotion hopes will rest upon them collecting the full three points when visited by Henlow at their Marston Playing Field Headquarters.

Over at Bedford Road Recreation Ground, Sandy will be expected to return to winning ways on home soil when FC Meppershall now without an away win in five outings come calling. Whilst at Cople Playing Fields, hosts Bedford Sports Athletic will start favourites for the full three points when they go into local derby action against Caldecote Reserves.

The final action in this section, taking place on The Green, where Ickwell & Old Warden Reserves play hosts to Meltis Albion.

In Division Two, the programme is one of just four games, for championship chasing Lea Sports PSG it is a trip to Whiston Crescent looking for away win number five on the bounce against hosts Clifton who have lost their last three home games. Whilst at King George VI Playing Fields, if they are to stay in the promotion race, three points are required by hosts Kings AFC when they entertain Stopsley Park.
