Monday night April 11th 2011 Round-up

The lone Division Two action tonight saw Elstow Abbey take their unbeaten home ways up to eight games and stretch their lead at the head of the league table to five points with a 3-0 win over Marabese Ceramics. Dave McCarthy and Harry Ellis netting in the opening half before McCarthy added a third in the second period.

In Division Three, M & DH Oakley climbed the league table into third spot following their 4-3 win at Renhold Village. Jack Goodacre, Jamie McLennan, James Dean and Adam Emms on their scoresheet against Village replies via Pete Neal, Carl Townsend and AJ Stewart.

Elsewhere, Shefford Town & Campton A have now lost their last eight home games to remain on the bottom of the league table after being beaten 0-3 by Royal Oak Kempston. Lorrenzo Jordan, Gareth Arzu and Andrew Palombella netting the goals to end The Oaks run of three consecutive away defeats.

For Cranfield United Reserves, it was the collection of three points when Caldecote A fail to raise a side to meet them at Crawley Road.

272nd game of the season. (Match 10,022) Wednesday 6th April 2011. Lea Sports PSG 1 Shefford Town & Campton Reserves 1 (Bedfordshire County League Division 2) (Played at Pirton Recreation Ground) (6pm kick off) att 10 approx. I had been looking forward to revisiting this ground for some time as I hadn't seen a match here since I watched Pirton beat Warboys 4-0 in a Hinchingbrooke Cup 1st Round match on 13 October 1985 att 100 approx. Furthermore I had been told that the stand this former South Midlands League Premier Division club used at the time was still there and so it was. I arrived shortly after 6pm kick off, but they had just started. Apparently there was some football match on TV people wanted to see afterwards. I sat in the stand on some red metal benches for a short while, but soon left as I was getting GBH of the ear drums from the home manager, who was also in the stand, as he 'encouraged' his side to do better! From what I saw of their first half performance he needed to do this as they were getting nowhere against a useful visiting side before the break. In fact it was Shefford who took a 26th minute lead although it came as Lea were just starting to come into the match. The equaliser came six minutes later when for me the player concerned miskicked the ball and fortunately for him it spun up in the air and looped over the keeper. After the break the hosts played much better and Shefford themselves continued to contribute. I then shot off to Barton Rovers to watch another game, but for unexplained reasons on arrival I found that the game was postponed!

Co-op Sports will now face AFC Turvey under Potton United's Hollow floodlights on Wednesdy April 27th after netting a 5-2 home win over Thurleigh. Scott Davis with a brace plus strikes from Chris Vardy, Thomas Miller and James McMulkin only being replied to by Steve Pledge and Pasquale Ventriglia.

Preview for week commencing Saturday 23rd April 2011.

For both of the leading Premier Division supported by Sportsform title contenders, it's far from easy games this weekend. Shefford Town & Campton, although still unbeaten on home turf this season face tough opposition when third place Wilshamstead come calling upon them at Rectory Road.Whilst Blunham, winners of their last four away outings travel to face Leighton United at Stanbridge Road.

Down at the other end of the table, it's a big day for both Woburn and AFC Kempston Town as they seek out the points to avoid a bottom two finish. The Safari Boys in home Crawley Road action against a Sharnbrook side that has won just three times on the road this season, whilst Town head to Horseshoe Close to be hosted by Dunton.

The final action in the top flight comes at Harvey Close where hosts Caldecote will be the favourites to collect the points off of their visitors Flitwick Town who have failed to win any of their last five away outings.
