Action Round -Up Monday 18th April 2011.

Division One.

FC Meppershall with braces of goals from Keiron Langley and Craig Damon took their winning home ways up to four games, with a 4-3 victory over AFC Kempston Town who remain rooted to the bottom of the league table and now without a point from their last eight games, Town's replies coming via Jamie Felts twice and Jessie Sidhu.

Division Two

Lea Sports PSG retained their seasons unbeaten home ways and took their overall unbeaten run up to 15 games with a 4-1 victory over Stopsley Park. James Awofisan with a hat-trick plus a strike from Ryan Coote doing the damage against a Park reply via Robert Maina.

Now up into third slot are Westoning Recreation Club, they ended Lidlington United Sports unbeaten six game away run by beating them 6-2 at Greenfield Road. Glen Cooksley with a hat-trick, Tom Smith with a brace plus Lewis Wilson seeing their goals only replied to by Gary Smith and Alex Burrows.

278th game of the season. (Match 10,028) Monday 11th April 2011. Dunton 1 Caldecote 1 (Biggleswade & District Knock Out Cup Semi Final) att 35 approx. On a night which became increasingly chilly as the game progressed this was a keenly contested semi final which went all the way, to penalties. Once again the grass was a tinge long in the corners, but it's remarkable how the players can play such good football on surfaces like this. It was David Pugh who deservedly gave Dunton the lead on 21 minutes with a well hit shot from the edge of the area. This stirred the all star Caldecote line up into action and on 45(+1) Matt Lee Dell chipped home the equaliser from the corner of the penalty area. In the second half both sides went for it with Caldecote having the best chance to get the winner when in some eyes they were generously awarded a spot kick after a keeper lunge with the ball going out of play. But the resultant shot went wide. No extra time in this competition. Just as well as black clouds were appearing and it was getting dark quickly. 12 spot kicks were needed to decide the outcome. Dunton missed the 11th so Caldecote went through to the final.

This was a ground I hadn't visited since 20 April 1988 when goals by Watts (2) Carlisle and Watson saw Stevington beat Mogerhanger United 4-0 in a Bedford & District League Premier Division match, att 20 approx. You could tell which team was which as they arrived. Many of the visiting team turned up in their works vans, hoping for a night on the tiles perhaps! On a warm evening with no wind the first half saw some good quality football played and it was difficult to split the sides. However I don't recall either keeper having to make a save. In the second half it was initially more of the same with one of the visiting side claiming that everyone was treating the ball like a hot potato. But eventually it was Stevington who were grateful for small murphys when Danny King scored the only goal on 63 minutes to put a chip in the Ceramics hopes and just as the teams were starting to run out of ideas. Eventually they may have deserved their win on an evening when we saw a decent, sporting game which was well refereed.

On the previous Saturday they had won the league without so much as dropping a point all season and tonight they were playing the bottom side, managed by Graham Norman. I've sort of known Graham for quite a few years now as our paths crossed when he was manager of Elstow Abbey. He did programmes for them and now does the same for Wootton Village. Before the start he was telling me that the nine adverts in it net the club £350 and he rightly wonders why other clubs can't do the same to make some easy money! Having said that I think that he would be the first to admit that he hasn't spent the money on strengthening his team! However I thought that for the most part they put up a good show against the hosts who have some decent players in their side. Perhaps the turning point

Jubilee Cup Semi-final to be replayed.

The management committee of The Bedfordshire County Football League met on Wednesday evening April 20th 2011 to consider the matter of Elstow Abbey FC fielding an under aged player in their Jubilee Cup Semi-final tie with Kings AFC held on March 28th 2011. Plus in six recent league matches.

After consideration of all the information and evidence available, it was fully accepted 100% that Elstow Abbey FC had not been party to the falsification of the registration form lodged by the club with The Bedfordshire County Football League.

As a consequence the following decisions were made.

The player in question, not to be allowed to register with The Bedfordfordshire County Football League upon reaching his 16th birthday in May 2011 until the 1st January 2012.

The Jubilee Cup Semi-final tie with Kings AFC to be deemed null and void and replayed on Friday 29th April 2011 at Second Meadow Biggleswade United FC, Kick Off 7.30pm. A suitable date then to be sought for the final tie that was due to be played at Second Meadow on that evening.

In all six league fixtures the said player has participated in, the points to be awarded to their opposition with a 0-0 scoreline applying.

Before a 100 plus sun-drenched crowd at Forde Park Langford on Friday evening, Bedfordshire County Football League President Terry Sadler was on hand to present Gamlingay United skipper Dan Walker with the cup following their 2-1 victory over Caldecote Reserves.

With Caldecote goalkeeper Jason Willis apparently struggling with a groin injury from the opening minute, one always felt that United who ply their trade in The Cambridgeshire Football County League Division 1A, where they currently sit in fifth position were going to be the favourites to lift the trophy.

Just five minutes into the contest United took the lead with a strike from Matt Willie and when former Biggleswade Town striker and man of the match Jamie Steele doubled the lead on 34 minutes you feared a cricket score might be on the cards.

However, following three sets of on the field treatment for Willis, Caldecote manager Andy McColl wisely curtailed his evening and sent on Dan Hall to replace him between the posts. Whilst you would not have faulted Willis for either of the goals, Hall's presence between the sticks seemed to add a certain amount of confidence to their backline as they comfortably held United at bay to go in at half-time just the two goals down.

The second period was a much more even affair and when Caldecote's Paul Gower pulled a goal back 11 minutes from time it signalled a nervous ending to the contest for United before referee Alex Rayment blew the final whistle.

So United regained the cup they won in 2008-09 but the real winner was charity, with £406 being raised via a £266 gate and £140 raffle.
