Action Review From Wednesday 20th January 2010

With the predicted rain and snow staying away Biggleswade United Reserves took full advantage to move up to fourth spot in The Premier Division supported by Sportsform table with a 4-1 home victory over Sharnbrook. Despite the visitors looking the better side in the opening half it was United who went in at half-time a goal in front after Tony Norman on the backpost headed home a Byn Williams corner just six minutes before the half-time cuppa break.

For those of the 20plus crowd who alongside United's Technical Manager of Football Brian Swords, lingered over the Rosie Lea to long, they suffered the fate of missing the games next two goals. Within three minutes of the re-start Darren Wallinger had levelled matters up for the visitors only to see Jack Gabbitas restored United's advantage just 60 seconds later.

The games real turning point arriving on the hour mark, when visiting goalkeeper Andrew Lawrence planted a goal kick straight at the feet of United's James Honeyman who capitalized on the error to send the ball whizzing back passed him and take United 3-1 clear and on their way to the three points.

Honeyman then sealing the contest with the games best goal of the night 11 minutes from time, a neatly struck volley from the edge of the area to give Lawrence no chance of redeeming himself for his earlier error.

Action Review From Saturday 23rd January 2010

Premier Division supported by Sportsform

Blunham's lead at the head of the Premier Division supported by Sportsform table is now down to five points after their nine game winning run was halted by Sharnbrook who held them to 1-1 draw on their own patch, Matty McMahon shooting the league leaders ahead after 15 minutes only to see Lawrence Bentham level matters up in the games final minute.

Meanwhile, second place Ickwell & Old Warden took full advantage of Blunham's slip up by netting their seventh consecutive league win, with a 6-3 home win over bottom of the table Westoning Recreation Club. However Ickwell were twice to trail

in the contest, Luke Redhead first shooting The Rec Boys ahead before Zak Rowe levelled matters, Dean Gadsden then restored the lead for the visitors only to see Rowe once again hit the back of the net for 2-2, after which two goals from Steve Thomas and strikes from Andrew Vallom and Rakesh Gill were only replied to by another strike from Redhead to leave Ickwell 6-3 winners.

Ickwell's win now takes them six points clear of third place Caldecote who were held to a 2-2 draw at Southill Alexander, Paul Lawrence giving Caldecote a first half lead before two goals from Jason Lynch in the opening 20 minutes of the second period shot the home side in front until a 70th minute strike from Dan Wilson ensured the points were shared.

Still very much in the Championship race are fourth place Oakley Sports, who if they won all their games in hand, would go to the head of the table. However it took a 90th minute strike from John Searle to earn them their sixth away win on the trot and the three points from a 4-3 victory at Woburn. All started well enough for The Sportsman, when goals from Searle and Stuart Kelly took them 2-0 ahead until Martin Holland struck to take the sides in at the break separated by the narrowest of margins.

Kelly was to strike again two minutes into the new period to see Oakley lead 3-1, but a David Stocker penalty to make it 2-3 had their nervous jangling and it looked points lost when home player Andy Skolsky levelled matters on 85 minutes, that was until Searle came to the rescue with his late winner.

Things seem to be going from bad to worse for Dunton, who went down to their eighth straight league defeat when beaten on home soil 1-2 by Renhold United, to give the visitors their first win in six league outings. Damon Quigley placing United in front 15 minutes into the game before James Cooper levelled matters 10 minutes from the break, United's winner then arriving 20 minutes into the second period from a Paul Beattie header.

However, for Campton, it was a return to winning ways after four straight defeats with a 4-2 home win over Biggleswade United Reserves, given the perfect start by a Wayne Goldsmith goal in the opening 60 seconds, they were then to trail when both Dan Thomas and Jack Gabbitas netted inside a minute around the quarter of an hour mark, only to see Andrew Hayday make it 2-2 with the games third goal inside a three minute period 60 seconds later. By half-time Adam Larsen with a strike on 35 minutes and Dan Wood five minutes later had shot the home side 4-2 ahead which was to become the final scoreline mainly due to the second half exploits of home goalkeeper Gary Cullerton.

Bedfordshire FA Senior Trophy Round Three

Blagan with a brace and Ayaz Hussain netting the other goals against Kings replies from Rowan Hazelwood with a brace plus Ryan Kelly and an Oliver Pleasted penalty.

Preview Saturday 30th January 2010

Premier Division supported by Sportsform action this weekend should, subject to ground availability, take league leaders Blunham on the road to Greenfield Road, to face bottom of the table Westoning Recreation Club looking for their sixth consecutive away league win against their hosts who have won just twice on home soil this season. The game is in danger of being postponed if Westoning Recreation Club Reserves fail to find an alternative pitch for their delayed Bedfordshire FA Junior Cup tie at home to Heath Panthers United. Whilst for second place Ickwell & Old Warden, who now only trail them by five points with a game in hand, it's also a trip on the road in search of their eighth win on the bounce, when they journey to Jubilee Playing Fields to face a Wilshamstead side that has lost just once in it's last seven outings and who will be no easy nut to crack.

Realistically, just four other clubs remain in the 2009-10 Season Championship race, of these Oakley Sports at the moment look the biggest danger as they make the short journey to Lodge Road and a meeting with local rivals Sharnbrook, the Sportsman travelling winners of their last six away games to face a home side that last lost on home soil way back in late September.

Whilst for Biggleswade United Reserves who last won on their league travels some five league games ago it's a trip to face one of the other challengers Renhold United at their Playing Fields Headquarters, where the hosts will be looking for their first home success since turning over Sharnbrook in early November.

The other Championship chasing club are of course Caldecote, who host local rivals Dunton at Harvey Close, the visitors travelling having lost all of their last eight league outings.

Elsewhere, other top flight action comes at Hillgrounds, where AFC Kempston Town, beaten just once on home soil this season in league action receive a visit from Southill Alexander, who travel looking for their first win on the road in six outings and at Rectory Road, the venue for Campton's home encounter with Woburn.

The Division One league programme is restricted to just four games due to the delayed playing of four ties in Round One of The Centenary Cup. In those quartet of games league leaders Flitwick Town go into Steppingley Road action seeking their fifth home win on the bounce against Marston Social who last tasted success on the road as long ago as late September at Stevington.

Meanwhile over at Cople Playing Fields, Bedford Sports Athletic receive a visit from promotion chasing Meltis Albion, who travel in search of their fourth away win on the bounce. Whilst other action comes at Moggerhanger Playing Fields, where Blunham Reserves host Henlow and at Bedford Road Recreation Ground, the venue for Sandy's home encounter with Kempston.

In that quartet of Centenary Cup ties, it's local derby action on The Green between Ickwell & Old Warden Reserves and Campton Reserves for the right to host either Kempston Hammers Sports or Leighton United who meet at Cutler Hammer in a last eight tie the following weekend.

Meanwhile, just down the road from The Green at Harvey Close, Caldecote Reserves will be in home action against FC Meppershall, the reward for the winners is a trip to Henlow. The fourth tie seeing Stevington host AFC Kempston Town Reserves in the knowledge that victory will give them another home tie at the last eight stage against Bedford Sports Athletic.

In Division Two, the Championship title race already looks down to a three club race with current league leaders Bedford Hatters who host Brache Sparta Community Reserves at Miller Road, the firm favourites for the silverware; but don't tell that to current second placers Potton Wanderers, who head to Groveside for a tricky looking fixture against Marabese Ceramics or to third place Marston Shelton Rovers who host Great Barford now unbeaten in their last twelve league outings.

The pick of the remainder of the Division Three action sees Shefford Town look to return to winning home ways when they host local rivals Arlesey Social Galacticos, who travel themselves looking to repair the damage of losing their last two away games. Whilst it will be a major surprise at King George VI Playing Fields if Kings AFC, now unbeaten at home in league action since the opening day of the season, fail to collect the full three points when paid a visit by bottom of the table Shillington, who travel for their 13th league encounter of the campaign still seeking their first win of the season.

Other action in this Division comes at The Bedford Hockey Centre, where Harpur FC, winners of their last two home games host Kempston Royals and at Whiston Crescent, where Clifton go in search of their first home league win of the season against a travelling Elstow Abbey side that is yet to win on the road this campaign.

With another series of Group games taking place in The Watson Shield, the Division Four league action comprises of just four games, yet those games will see the top two sides in action. For league leaders Sundon Park Rangers, it's a defence of their seasons unbeaten home record when they host Stewartby Village in Stockwood Park.

Whilst second place Sharnbrook Reserves hit the road for Hillgrounds and a meeting with Kempston Athletic.

Hillgrounds is also the venue for Eastcotts home fixture with Flitwick Town Reserves, the hosts looking to take their unbeaten home ways to six games against a Town side that has won it's last three away league encounters.

Elsewhere at Keysoe Road, Thurleigh will be the firm favourites to collect the three points on offer when visited by a Bedford Park Rangers side whose away record to date reads, played six, lost six.

In those Watson Shield games, It's still all to play for in Group One where the action comes at Gold Street when Riseley Sports Reserves host Dinamo Flitwick and in Group Two, a point all better for visitors Liddington United Sports at Horseshoes Close against Dunton Reserves will see them safely into the last 16.

The final action being a Group Four meeting between hosts M& DH Oakley, who currently head the group standings and Queens Park Crescents who travel trailing them by just three points in second spot.
