Dean Hamilton, who scored thrice, is the Potton United captain, or he was when I last saw them play! This was a dull night caused by the ash coming out of the Icelandic volcano and not the dust coming from the cleaning of the trophy cabinet at the Emirates Stadium! Potton were 4-0 up at the break and potted a further four thereafter with Harrington getting three and Sam Worthington grabbing two Just a word about the extrovert ref who probably enjoyed the game more than the players. Derek Osborne may be in his latter years in the middle, but he still enjoys every moment of the game and younger refs could learn a lot from him.

**277th game of the season. (Match 9,700) Friday 23rd April 2010. Potton Wanderers 4 Renhold Village 2 (Beds FA Junior Challenge Cup Final) (Played at Potton United) att 220 approx.** Beds FA Cup Finals played at the Hollow have tended to be exciting affairs over the past few seasons and this one was no exception. The sometimes raucous crowd generated a good atmosphere and also enabled the much lamented Ron's Snax to make a welcome reappearance. If only attendances at Potton United's home matches could justify him appearing every week. I'd seen Potton Wanderers beat Shillington (Saturday) 8-0 at Mill Lane on the previous Monday. As they were going for the league title and the opposition were from a division lower of the Beds County League I was expecting the Wanderers to win this match quite easily, especially as they strolled through that game I saw. Not only that, but many of the Wanderers side have featured in Potton United's first team over the years and some of those present tonight wondered why they still don't! But despite this they didn't have it all their own way. Having said that though Potton were in the lead by half time. However on 6 minutes Renhold were in the lead. Townsend scored easily after a major cock up in the Wanderers defensive, with the fickle finger of fate largely pointing at the keeper. But Wanderers were level on 21 minutes when Aris guided home a deep cross from the right, almost placing the ball home. Then on 40 minutes Hearson beat the offside trap, just, to slot home and so extracted some form of revenge from the micky taking he was receiving from the Renhold fans. They had generally been quite quiet except for one lady who shouted so much that I think that

she eventually lost her voice. I wouldn't say that she was loud, but I no longer need a hearing aid! Apparently she makes a good cup of tea though. Victory for Potton seemed assured when Sam Worthington made it 3-1 on 50 minutes, but on 65 minutes Renhold were awarded a spot kick and the perpetrator was invited to leave the pitch. From where we were sitting in the stand this looked a dodgy decision, but listening to the 'expert opinions' of local referees, Messrs Hallett & Redman it was concluded, for a variety of reasons that indeed the decision was correct. The spot kick was converted and Renhold were back in the match and soon they missed two good chances to equalise. But Wanderers fought back and on 80 minutes Worthington headed home his second goal from a long free kick to severely limit the Villagers chances of winning. Things got worse for them on 89 minutes when one of their players suffered a nasty injury and had to be carried off on a stretcher. This led to about 15 minutes of injury time being played and despite this Wanderers had enough about them to see off the plucky Villagers.

Blunham moved themselves back onto the top of the Premier Division supported by Sportsform league table by coming from 1-3 down to record a 4-3 home victory over start of play league leaders Ickwell & Old Warden, for whom it was a first defeat in 18 outings. Martin Holland shooting The Safari Boys in front before Paul Lawrence levelled matters to take the teams in at the break all square. ### **The Final Countdown**

In The Premier Division supported by Sportsform, the battle is on for a top six finish when AFC Kempston Town host Southill Alexander at Hillgrounds. Whilst at Lodge Road, Sharnbrook entertain Woburn with both sides knowing a win will lift them above 10th place Renhold United in the league standings.

In Division One action, Kempston will finish the season in sixth spot should they find a way of beating already promoted Leighton United when they come to visit them at their Cutler Hammer headquarters. Whilst Marston Social will finish the season in third spot with a home victory over Meltis Albion. However, a win for The Albion would give them at least a sixth place finish and leave Social in fourth spot.

The final action of the day being in Division Four at Keysoe Road, where hosts Thurleigh require a win over their visitors Flitwick Town Reserves to jump above them into fourth place in the final league standings.
