Preview Saturday 13th November 2010

Premier Division supported by Sportsform action this weekend brings about a home game for current league leaders Wilshamstead at their temporary Houghton Conquest Playing Field base,bottom of the table Arlesey Town Reserves being the visitors. The hosts still unbeaten on home soil will be fully expected to collect the three points on offer against a visiting Town side that will travel in search of their first away win of the season.

For second place Renhold United, it's home Renhold Playing Field action against Caldecote. United starting the day still unbeaten in the league this season against a Caldecote side that has won just one of its four outings away from Harvey Close this season.

Just down the road at Lodge Road, Sharnbrook will be playing hosts to third place Blunham. Sharnbrook in this their eighth home outing of the campaign seeking just win number three in front of their own fans against a visiting side that has won three of it's four away outings this term.

It's local derby action at the Carlsberg Stadium, where hosts Southill Alexander go in search of the points to lift them away from the relegation zone against fourth place visitors Shefford Town & Campton. The final game of the day in this section coming at Miller Road, Meltis Albion taking on Bedford Sports Athletic to seek revenge for their 5-2 beating at Cople Playing Fields just 14 days ago.

In Division Two, league leaders Queens Park Crescents are in home action in Mowsbury Park facing Bromham United. The hosts looking for home win number seven from just eight outings against a United side that has won three of its four away encounters to date this season.

For second place Arlesey Social Galacticos, its a trip on the road to Greenfield Road to face Westoning Recreation Club. Whilst near neighbours and fellow promotion contenders Clifton head for the Bedford Hockey Centre still unbeaten on the road this season to face Harpur FC.

Also very much in the promotion race are Lea Sports PSG, they will be in home Pirton Recreation Ground action against Lidlington United Sports. The hosts seeking to preserve their 100% home unbeaten ways against a United side that has failed to win on any of its last five trips away from Hurst Grove.

Down at the other end of the table, Kempston Hammers Sports will search out their first home win of the season when Great Barford pay them a visit at their Cutler Hammer base. Whilst Kings AFC head to Rectory Road to face a Shefford Town & Campton Reserves outfit that seeks its first home win in three outings.

Other action in this division sees Stevington in home action against Marabese Ceramics, whilst Elstow Abbey head to the Luton Regional Sports Centre to take on Stopsley Park.

For the top two clubs in Division Three it's games on home soil to maintain their title hopes. 100% at home league leaders Pavenham in Hillgrounds action against a Dunton Reserves side that has won just once away from Horseshoes Close this season. Whilst second place M & DH Oakley, still 100% at home themselves this season feature in the game of the day from this division, when they host fellow promotion candidates Sundon Park Rangers at their Playing Field Headquarters.
